Dear Candidate for Superintendent of Public Instruction,

Several of our members have asked where each of you stand on Early Childhood Education. Our candidate survey did not cover this important topic; and we feel that its important to let **Wyoming citizens** know your thoughts. No doubt you are tired of answering questions at this stage of the race, but if you would take a few minutes to respond to the following questions, our members would greatly appreciate it. Feel free to hit 'reply' to this email and just type in your answers.

1. Which of the following do you prefer as wording for **Wyoming's** school attendance law?

A) The parent or guardian of any child resident in this state shall cause the child to be instructed in subjects commonly and usually taught in the public schools of the state of Wyoming. To accomplish this, a parent or guardian shall either cause the child to be privately instructed by, or at the direction of, his parent or guardian; or enrolled in a public school or public charter school, including an online or virtual charter school or private or parochial school during a period in each year equal to that in which the public schools are in session; there to conform to the attendance policies and regulations established by the board of trustees, or other governing body, operating the school attended.

B) Every parent, guardian or other person having control or charge of any child who is a resident of this state and whose seventh birthday falls on or before September 15 of any year and who has not yet attained his sixteenth birthday or completed the tenth grade shall be required to send such child to, and such child shall be required to attend, a public or private school each year, during the entire time that the public schools shall be in session in the district in which the pupil resides; provided, that the board of trustees of each school district may exempt any child from the operation of this article when...

Answer: A – I strongly support parents being able to exercise options with respect to their children's education, whether that means **homeschooling or choosing a private, charter or Christian school. While I believe in the public schools system overall, those families who need or want to find a different option that is better for their children should be supported in doing so. The government's role is to provide the public school but the responsibility to educate children lies with parents.**

Answer: Given the ever-growing encroachment of government into private lives, I am supportive of the idea of articulating parental rights. I have not thoughtfully weighed whether parental rights should rise to the level of a constitutional amendment. The consistent judicial interpretations of parents' rights demonstrate the strength of our Constitution as the guiding principles limiting the ability of government to interfere. Because I hold the Constitution to be inviolate, I believe it is critical to be very thoughtful about amending it.
